Focus: Listening comprehension, vocabulary development, emotion awareness,

question asking

#### **LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

#### Students will:

Listen actively to a short digital story or video.

- Identify and respond to feelings shown or discussed in a media message.
- Practice asking simple, thoughtful questions.
- Begin to understand how emotions can influence decisions.
- Use pictures, actions, or words to express what they have learned.

#### WATCH + LISTEN

Before playing the video, say:

"Let's watch a short video about being smart and thoughtful when we see something online or on a screen. Listen for the rule Media Masters follow!"

# **AFTER-VIEWING QUESTIONS (Whole Group Discussion)**

Use pictures or hand gestures to support comprehension if needed.

- 1. "What do Media Masters always do before they say or do something online?" (Answer: They think first!)
- 2. "What does AQBS stand for?" (Ask Questions. Be Skeptical.)
- 3. "What should you do if something on the internet makes you feel mad or sad?" (Ask questions about the feeling and wait before doing anything.)
- 4. "Can you name a question Media Masters might ask?" (Is this true? Why am I feeling this way?)
- 5. "Is it okay to not say anything on social media?" (Yes! You can just wait or not respond.)

# **ACTIVITY IDEAS (Choose 1–2)**

#### 1. Feeling Faces + Question Match

- Give kids emoji-style cards ( co co co co).
- Show them short, simple "social media style" images or scenarios (e.g., a sad dog picture, a kid showing a trophy).
- Ask:
  - "What feeling does this give you?" (Hold up matching face.)
  - "What question could we ask?" (Model: "Is this really true?" "Why does this make me feel sad?")

#### 2. Emotion Freeze Dance - AQBS Style!

- Play music. Kids dance.
- Stop the music and call out an emotion ("Angry!" "Excited!").
- Kids freeze with that emotion on their face/body.
- Ask: "What could a Media Master do if they feel this way online?" (Prompt: "Ask Questions! Be Skeptical!")

### 3. Draw and Tell: My Media Master Mind!

Prompt: "Draw a superhero who stops to think before posting online."

- Ask students to "tell about" their superhero:
  - O What do they do when they feel strong feelings?
  - O What questions do they ask?

# **VOCABULARY TO INTRODUCE**

- **Emotion** a feeling inside (happy, sad, angry)
- Question something we ask when we want to know more
- True real and correct
- False not real or not right
- **Skeptical** being unsure until we know more

#### **REMEMBER & REPEAT**

When you feel something strong...

Ask Questions. Be Skeptical!

(Chant together, make hand gestures, or create a classroom poster with these words.)
