Meet the Critical Thinking Characters!

Grade Level: 2nd Grade

Length: 25–30 minutes

Before Watching the Video

Teacher/Librarian Says:

“Today you’re going to meet some silly characters who made mistakes online — and YOU get to learn how to fix their mistakes using Media Master Moves! These moves help you **THINK FIRST** before you click, like, or share.”

Ask:

- “Have you ever seen something online that tricked you?”
- “Why should we stop and think before we react online?”
- “What do you think ‘Media Master Move’ means?”

Watch the Video

Title: BONUS LESSON – *Critical Thinking Characters: Think First Before You Click*

Run Time: 2–4 minutes

Listening Focus for Grade 2:

“Listen for the **THINKING MISTAKE** and the **MEDIA MASTER MOVE** that fixes it. You’ll need them for your activity!”



After Watching – Discussion Questions

1. “Which character made the funniest mistake?”
2. “Which character made the most *dangerous* mistake?”
3. “What does it mean to ‘check before you share’?”
4. “How can we turn a mistake into a Media Master Move?”
5. “Why is being kind online one of the Media Master rules?”

Encourage students to give *short explanations* like:

- “Zack forgot to stop scrolling.”
- “Robot shared too fast.”
- “The Media Master Move helps us fix mistakes.”



Activity: Character Fix-It Sort!

Objective: Identify online thinking mistakes + match them to Media Master Moves

Materials:

- Worksheet or printed cards
- Crayons or pencils

Part 1 – Match the Mistake to the Move

Show students **five characters** with short, simple mistakes:

1. **Scroll Zombie Zack** – Scrolls too long
2. **Re-Post Robot** – Shares everything
3. **Mean Maddy** – Posts hurtful words
4. **Meme Believer Cassy** – Believes every meme
5. **Snap Judgment Sammy** – Makes guesses without checking

Show the **Media Master Moves**:

- “Take breaks – YOU’re in control.”
- “Check before you share.”

- “Choose kindness when you post.”
- “Be curious — look for truth.”
- “Ask questions first.”

Student Task: Draw a line from each Character to the correct Media Master Move.

Part 2 – Fix the Character! (Draw + Write)

Each student chooses ONE character and completes:

Draw:

A quick picture of the character *after* they use the Media Master Move.

Write (1-2 sentences):

“__ can fix their mistake by ___. That makes them a Media Master!”

Example:

“Re-Post Robot can check the truth before sharing. That makes him a Media Master!”

** Extension Activity:

“True, Untrue, or Unkind?” Sorting Challenge**

Teacher Prep:

Use simple examples on cards:

- “Kittens can fly to the moon!”
- “You should ignore new students.”
- “Math shortcut video that helps with homework.”
- “A meme that says broccoli gives you superpowers!”

Student Task:

Sort each into:

 **CHECK FIRST** – could be fake or silly

 **CHOOSE KINDNESS** – kind or helpful

 **STOP! NOT OKAY** – hurtful or unkind

This reinforces truth-checking, kindness, and skepticism.



Wrap-Up

Teacher/Librarian Says:

“You met a LOT of characters today — but YOU made all the smart choices! When you Think First, Check for Truth, and Choose Kindness, you are a real Media Master.”

Call-and-Response:

Teacher: “When you see something online...”

Students: “**THINK FIRST!**”

Teacher: “Before you share...”

Students: “**CHECK FOR TRUTH!**”

Teacher: “And when you post...”

Students: “**CHOOSE KINDNESS!**”

“You did great today, Media Masters — smart thinkers make the internet better!”

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
