

Lesson #1: The Rubber Band Rule — "Your Online Actions Can Come Back to You."

1. What the Rubber Band Rule Really Means

The Rubber Band Rule reminds us that everything you post, send, comment, or share online can return to you later—sometimes in ways you didn't expect. This includes deleted posts, private messages, screenshots, and posts you made years ago.

Middle schoolers begin building real digital footprints. A Media Master always asks: "Will this help me later—or snap back and cause problems?"

2. Snap Back Scenarios — What Could Go Wrong?

Read each situation. Explain in one or two sentences how it could "snap back."

- You post a joke about a friend, thinking they'll "get it."
- 2. You share a trending rumor without checking if it's true.
- You vent online about a teacher or coach.

- 4. You post a short video acting silly or irresponsible.
- 5. You leave a sarcastic or rude comment on someone's post.

3. Think First Analysis Boxes

For each scenario, mark the MOST responsible choice.

A classmate posts something exaggerated about themselves to get attention.

□ Repost it□ Comment a joke□ Pause and consider how this reflects on them before sharing	
Someone sends you a screenshot of a private conversation.	
□ Share it with others□ Ignore it□ Tell them you don't share private info and encourage respect
