1. What Is AQBS?

The AQBS Rule helps middle school students become smarter, safer digital citizens by slowing down before reacting online.

- A Ask
- **Q** Questions
- B Be
- S Skeptical

It means you:

- ✓ Don't assume a post is true
- ✓ Don't react emotionally
- ✓ Look for purpose, evidence, and accuracy
- √ Think before you click, share, or comment
