1. What Does AQBS Mean?

Ask Questions.

Be Skeptical.

It means: **Don't believe everything you see online right away!**

Media Masters **stop, think, and ask questions first.**

2. Circle the Posts You Should Ask Questions About

(Teacher inserts simple images: a flying hamster, a sad friend post, a dinosaur on a beach, a normal weather report)

Student directions:

Circle the pictures that look “too silly” or “too surprising.”

Those are the ones you should ask questions about!

3. Emotion Check!

Sometimes posts make us feel big feelings.

Draw a line to match the feeling to the picture.

 Happy

 Angry

 Sad

 Surprised

(Teacher inserts 4 simple emotion pictures or emojis)

Media Master Tip:

When you feel a *big feeling*, that's your clue to **stop and ask questions!**

4. Ask a Question!

Look at each picture your teacher shows.

Say (or write) **ONE question** you could ask before believing it.

Examples kids might give:

- “Is this real?”
- “Who posted it?”
- “Could this be a trick?”
