1. Multiple Choice

Correct answer: B

Responding with strong emotions before thinking

2. Multiple Choice

Correct answer: C

Asking for proof before accepting something as true

3. True or False

1. **T** – Strong emotional reactions *can* cloud judgment
2. **F** – Lots of likes does *not* mean trustworthy
3. **T** – Emotions are valid, but shouldn't control behavior

4. Fill in the Blank

5. Short Answer – Suggested Response

Students should mention BOTH:

- Emotions can trick us into reacting too quickly.
- Asking questions / looking for proof helps prevent spreading misinformation.

Example acceptable answer:

“Strong emotions can make you react too fast and believe something without checking it. Looking at both your feelings and the evidence helps you make a smarter choice.”

6. Matching – Emotional vs. Evidence Questions

Item	Correct Answer
1. “Why am I feeling this way?”	A (Emotional Self-Check)
2. “What proof supports this claim?”	B (Evidence Check)
3. “Do I need to act on this feeling?”	A
4. “Is there any evidence that this is false?”	B

7. Scenario Challenge

Correct answer: C

Stop, question your emotional reaction, and look for credible sources.

8. Extended Response – Suggested Answer

Students should explain:

- Strong emotions can push someone to react, comment, or share without thinking.
- AQBS helps them pause, question feelings, and look for evidence first.

Example acceptable answer:

“If someone gets angry at a post, they might comment without checking if it’s true. Using the AQBS Rule helps them pause, ask questions, and check sources before reacting.”

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
