  - → REAL

Why: Trusted source.

- 4. 30-foot cat on school roof
  - → FAKE

Why: Physically impossible, Al-looking image.

Acceptable examples:

- "Big feelings make us click before thinking."
- "Strong emotions can override logic."
- "Emotional posts are often designed to manipulate."
