1. What Does "Candy" Mean Online?

In Media Masters Rock, candy is NOT real candy. It means the *reward* someone gets from a post:



Fame (people knowing you)

Popularity (likes + followers)

Every post gives candy to someone!



2. Who Gets the Candy?

Look at each picture your teacher shows. Circle the person who gets the candy.

Examples (teacher inserts simple pictures):

- A kid sharing a funny cat video → Circle **the kid** (popularity)
- A person selling shoes online → Circle **the seller** (money)
- A kid helping a friend by sharing a tip → Circle **both** (helpful candy)



Draw a line to match the post with the candy type.

Post

- 1 A funny picture that gets lots of likes
- 2 A video someone made to earn money
- 3 A helpful tip for beating a video game level

Candy

- Popularity
- Money
- Good Feeling / Helping Others

(Students match with lines.)

? 4. Ask the Candy Question!

For each picture your teacher shows, answer out loud or write:

"Who's getting the candy?"

Student may answer:

- "The person who made it!"
- "The kid who shared it!"
- "The helper!"
- "The seller!"

Any thoughtful answer earns a Media Master high-five.

5. Kind Candy vs. Mean Candy

Circle the candy that is **GOOD** for the internet:

- Helping others
- Sharing something kind
- Making someone smile
- X Making fun of someone
- X Posting to hurt feelings
- X Sharing lies

6. Draw Your Own Candy Post!

On a separate sheet of paper, draw:

A post that gives **GOOD CANDY** (helping, kindness, truth)

Then point an arrow to show who gets the candy!



7. Call & Response Practice

Teacher: "Every post gives what?"

Students: "CANDY!"

Teacher: "So what do Media Masters always ask?"

Students: "WHO'S GETTING THE CANDY?!"
