How Full Is It? - Evaluate: Helpful · Hurtful · Truthful

2. Analyze the Post

- 1. Game glitch fix → **Helpful**, possibly **Truthful** if accurate
- 2. "Don't sit with Jordan" → Hurtful
- 3. Jellyfish discovery w/article → Truthful, Helpful
- 4. Clickbait → Usually **Hurtful** (manipulative), **Not Truthful**
- 5. Fractions website → **Helpful**, likely **Truthful** if real

3. What Makes a Post Truthful?

Look for:

- It cites reliable sources
- Can be fact-checked
- Supported by evidence/data
- Reported by trustworthy outlets
- Not exaggerated or emotional manipulation

4. Case Study (Phone in Freezer)

Is it Helpful?

→ No. It gives unsafe advice; could damage the device.

Is it Hurtful?

→ Yes. It could cause harm by ruining someone's phone.

Is it Truthful? How to Check?

- → No. Students should:
 - Look for articles from tech/reputable sources
 - Check phone manufacturers' recommendations
 - Search multiple credible sites
 - Look for expert explanations

5. Fullness Test Questions (Examples)

- "Where is the information coming from?"
- "Is there evidence to back it up?"
- "Does this post hurt or help someone?"
- "Am I being emotionally manipulated?"
- "Can I verify this somewhere else?"

6. Optional Challenge

Teacher evaluates rewrites for:

- Removal of harm
- Added truth/evidence
- Kindness/constructive language
