



Lesson 4 – HOW FULL IS IT?

Grade 8 Quiz – Teacher Answer Key

1. Multiple Choice

Correct Answer: B

“How FULL is it?” helps Media Masters decide whether a post is **helpful, hurtful, or truthful**.

2. True or False

Correct Answer: TRUE

A post can be factual but still cause harm — Media Masters evaluate *both* truth and impact.

3. Categorize Each Post (Helpful • Hurtful • Truthful)

- A. A post that gives evidence-supported instructions for safer online gaming.
➔ **H (Helpful)** and also truthful, but “Helpful” is the priority category for this item.
- B. A post that spreads an unverified rumor claiming a student cheated on a test.
➔ **HF (Hurtful)** and untruthful, but “Hurtful” is the key concern here.
- C. A post encouraging students to donate items to a local shelter.
➔ **H (Helpful)**

4. Evidence Evaluation — Multiple Choice

Correct Answer: C

Students should look for **evidence from credible sources** before believing or sharing.

5. Short Response (Sample Acceptable Answers)

Students should express any idea close to:

- “Because a post can be true but still harmful, and we need to think about both before sharing.”
- “Media Masters protect people by checking truth AND impact.”
- “Stopping to think keeps us from spreading hurt or misinformation.”

Any well-reasoned variation is acceptable.

6. Scenario — Think Like a Media Master

Students must name **two** of the three How Full Is It questions:

- ✓ “How truthful is it?”
- ✓ “How hurtful is it?”
- ✓ “How helpful is it?”

Any two correct questions earn full credit.

7. Media Master Judgment — Choose the BEST option

Correct Answer: B

Even true information should not be shared if it could hurt someone unnecessarily.

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
