## **PART 2 — Analyze the Mistake (Sample Responses)**

### **Example 1**

**Character:** Headline Harry

**Explanation:** Harry believes everything he sees in a headline without reading the full article. This is a problem because headlines can be exaggerated or misleading. If he doesn't check the facts, he may share false information.

## Example 2

**Character:** Snap Judgement Sammy

**Explanation:** Sammy jumps to conclusions based on little information. This causes problems because he may unfairly blame people or believe false stories without proof.



## PART 3 — Media Master Fix-It Rewrite

### 1. “OMG this headline says our school is haunted! I’m reposting!”

**Corrected Media Master Response:**

“I should read the full article and check if it’s from a reliable source before I repost anything.”

### 2. “Everyone is laughing at this kid’s drawing — look!”

**Corrected Media Master Response:**

“I won’t share something that embarrasses someone. I’ll choose kindness instead.”

### 3. “I watched one video, so trust me — I know how to fix your computer.”

**Corrected Media Master Response:**

“I should look up more information or ask someone who really knows. One video isn’t enough to be an expert.”
