Steve Trash – Digital Citizenship Live Show (Media Masters Rock)

Program Activity Description (Ready to Paste)

The *Steve Trash Digital Citizenship Live Show* is a standards-aligned enrichment activity designed for K–8 students participating in 21st CCLC afterschool programming. Through interactive magic, music, comedy, and guided discussion, students learn essential digital citizenship skills, including pausing before reacting online, evaluating digital content, and making safe, responsible choices in digital spaces.
